LOUISA COUNTY DRIVEWAY & ENTRANCE PERMIT POLICY

05/18/2021

1. Authority:
 - a. Section 319.14, Code of Iowa, requires that all work performed within the County Right of Way conform with standards established by Louisa County Secondary Roads Department
 - b. Section 318.4, Code of Iowa, requires the County to remove all known road obstructions
 - c. No driveway entrances shall be constructed or extended on a secondary road without a permit
 - d. Unauthorized or improper entrances shall be repaired or removed by the County at the landowner's expense.
2. Pipe standards:
 - a. Pipe size and length shall be determined by the County on a case by case basis
 - b. A standard driveway will have a minimum 18" diameter pipe with a maximum length of 40'
 - c. Pipe material shall be: 14-gauge corrugated metal, dual wall HDPE or tied concrete pipe
3. Surfacing standards:
 - a. Surfacing on gravel roads may be earth or gravel, other with special permit
 - b. Residential or farm accesses off paved roads shall be gravel or paved
 - c. Commercial accesses off paved roads shall have a minimum 8 feet of pavement parallel to the road
4. Grading standards:
 - a. Maximum approaching slope on gravel roads shall be no steeper than 3/1
 - b. Maximum approaching slope on paved roads shall be no steeper than 6/1
 - c. Drives shall not drain onto county road unless permission has been granted
5. Installation Expenses:
 - a. All costs associated with installation, relocation or extension of a driveway shall be provided by the landowner including earthwork, pipe, and surfacing
 - b. County does not sell pipe, rock or dirt
 - c. The may County may haul fill dirt or install pipe supplied by a landowner if schedule allows on a first come first serve basis
6. Maintenance:
 - a. County may replace or repair standard 40 L.F. permitted driveway culverts when budget and work schedule allow
 - b. Rock replacement will only be provided when needed to maintain a suitable shoulder, generally 8' from a paved road. Rock beyond 8' or special permitted drives are the homeowner's responsibility
 - c. County initiated construction projects shall replace existing standard driveways with similar pipe and surfacing materials at County expense
7. Special Permits
 - a. Permits that vary from the stated policy may be granted by the Engineer on a case by case basis
 - b. In general, special permits may be granted if they meet current engineering and safety standards
 - c. Special permitted driveways shall be maintained and replaced by the landowner including rock, surfacing and pipe
 - d. Failure to maintain may lead to removal or replacement by County forces at the landowner's expense
